MONTVERDE WINS GRANT MONEY FOR TREE PLANTING

Montverde's town trail, Truskett park and a section of downtown will soon become more attractive. The town received \$18,075 non-matching grant from the 2010-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Funding for this project is provided by the USDA Forest Service through the Florida Division of Forestry's Urban and Community Forestry Grant Program.

Approximately 65 trees will be planted. The effort emphasizes environmental concepts of "Right Trees/Right Places" and "Going Native". The Town of Montverde is recognized for its preservation practices and is a new Tree City USA. As grant coordinator for Montverde's "Forest Health Improvement Initiative" I am collaborating with Juli D'Agostino. Town Clerk, on implementation. I really appreciate the effort Juli's putting into this plan. The work must be completed by July 2011 in order to receive reimbursement of funds.

Community involvement is important. Townspeople feel enormous satisfaction in planting community trees. Trees make our surrounding more pleasant. Properly placed and cared for trees decrease glare from pavement, reduce runoff, provide a summer cooling, filter out pollutants and add oxygen to the atmosphere. The town hopes the project will inspire local business and citizen volunteer beautification efforts along the route.

REMINDER FROM YOUR LOCAL CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Its summer time, the rain is falling and the grass is growing. Please remember to be cutting your grass every week. Having high grass on your property doesn't look good and can cause some unwanted creatures to appear. If your grass is in excess of 18 inches high you are in violation of ordinance 2008-20.

In 2003 the Town of Montverde started an ordinance to help avoid unnecessary wear and deterioration on streets and roads. It is required that you have a road apron constructed on your property with the proper permitting. Being that this ordinance went into effect in 2003 you don't have to have one if you have had your driveway before 2003. The ordinance number is 2003-01, Section 4-84.
