## Mayor's Message

Hello, I hope you and your family are doing well and staying safe. I'm excited to share some wonderful news! The Anthony Family, owner's of Kirk Island, attended our July Council meeting and generously offered to donate Kirk Island to the Town of Montverde. We are incredibly grateful for their generosity and are actively working with the Anthony family to move this forward.

I'd also like to give a big thank you to our Visioning Committee for their dedication and hard work. They currently have two active groups: One is focused on improving playground equipment at Kirk Park. The other is preparing a historical display for our new library, highlighting the rich history of Montverde. We're all looking forward to seeing the results of their efforts soon.

The Town Council continues to work through a variety of Capital projects. Here are some highlights:

**New Water Tower and Deep Well -** Includes upsized lines, system loops, and new fire hydrants to improve water infrastructure and fire protection.

New Fire Station - A joint project with Lake County, currently moving toward implementation.

Kirk Park Outdoor Restrooms - Construction is nearly complete, restrooms will be open for public use soon.

**Stormwater Improvement Projects - Multiple locations around Town are now in the engineering and planning phase.** 

Truskett Park Rebuild - In active coordination with FEMA for funding and redevelopment planning.

New Sidewalks - Being installed along State Road 455 and in various locations throughout the Town.

**Town Mobile App** - A new app is being developed to help residents stay up to date with Town news, events, and alerts.

**Lakeside Avenue Storm/Street Project -** Construction is currently underway.

**Porter and 1st Street Storm/Street Project -** This infrastructure project is actively progressing through development stages.


The Council is in the process of developing the 2025–2026 Town Budget. We've adopted a "not-to-exceed" millage rate of 2.8300 for Ad Valorem taxes, the same rate we've held for many years. Thanks to careful planning by our past and present Councils, Town Management, and the Town Hall team, we continue to remain financially sound and debt-free. By using County, State, and Federal grants, along with impact fees, we've successfully funded new projects without raising the millage rate.
