Hello, I hope you and your family are doing well.

A big issue the Council has been addressing for a while is people speeding in Montverde. We have increased the number of hours that FHP and Lake County Sheriff are patrolling our streets and FHP have issued a lot of tickets. As the population in the area increases this speeding problem is also increasing. Because route 455, Fosgate and Ridgewood are County roads we have asked the County to get involved with this issue. They are conducting a two-week study at the hill on CR 455, to document the number of vehicles and their speed. Lake County will be able to tell us the different tools they can use to help with this issue, like a four way stop or speed tables within the town on County roads. I will keep you up to date on this topic.

I know I keep saying this but I do feel the need, because it is a very important topic. Montverde is going through a time of change mostly because of how the area is growing. We must stay on top of how these changes effect our town. One example of this is 10,000 homes Minneola has in the pipeline next to Montverde on Hancock, all the way over to Sugarloaf mountain to Rt 561. We also have many open spaces inside our town limits that will be developed sometime in the near future when the correct situation comes along. A couple good example of this is the 114 acres over on Lake Apopka that use to be an orange grove and was recently cleared and then sold. Another example in town is the 53 acres off of Ridgewood on the left side coming from Rt 455 before Magnolia Terrace. Just these two locations could increase the town by over 300 homes. It is important that your Council understands what you want when it comes to growth. Our town is in a special situation, where we do not need growth to survive. We are able to manage with the millage rate of 2.83 (the lowest in Lake County) by planning correctly. I feel the more people that attend the Council meetings will help the Council move in the correct direction with the topics they address at monthly meetings.

Other exciting projects we are working on include: upgrades to the town water system, an expansion to the library, and some street and sidewalk projects.
