Water Bill With January and February having record breaking cold weather, please be advised you may see a jump in your water bill due to resident's pipes bursting during the hard freeze. Town Hall has already received many calls from residents on this matter.

A note from the Historical Committee - Did you know? A revolutionary development in the world of tractor mowing saw its beginning in Montverde in the post- World War II era. Lucius Neal Smith, a native son of Montverde, founded the Whirler-Glide Mower Company (8LA4079) here in 1948. The foundation of his business was small, self-propelled lawn mowers that he and a partner name Alexander Smith received a patent for in 1950. Smith soon began manufacturing what he dubbed the Snappin' Turtle Mower in his Montverde plant, which today is the current Source Link Building on 455. The patent was later sold to Southern Saw which became known as Snapper Lawn Equipment (United States Patent Office, 1950).

Stand up and be Counted The U.S. Constitution requires a national census every 10 years, this counts everyone residing in the United States. The

2010 Census will help the federal government decide based upon population how to allocate funds to the states and its communities. Census data also guides local decision-makers where to build new roads, hospitals, schools, childcare and senior centers, other-public works projects, and Emergency service centers. The data collected by the census also helps determine the number of seats your state has in the U.S. House of Representatives. The Census questionnaires will be mailed in March. It is the shortest in history with only 10 questions, it will take just 10 minutes to complete. Please do your part and be counted.

Preferred and Prohibited Plant and Tree species list The cool weather won't last forever. Spring is probably on everyone's mind. Many of you will begin new landscaping projects especially this year after the freezes destroyed exotic and tropical vegetation across the Town.

The Town encourages landscape projects as it will add to the beauty of our community. Please remember that the Town has enacted a new landscape ordinance. The new ordinance prohibits planting of invasive and some exotic plant and tree species including certain palms and tropical vegetation.

The new ordinance is not meant to be tedious. The intent is to protect property values and reduce future costs to the Town associated with removal of invasive and exotic plant species.

Tropical vegetation and palms can be attractive but should be used sparingly and appropriately in the Central Florida landscape. The Town's vision is to encourage and promote the use of Florida friendly and Florida native plants to increase property values and protect Florida ecosystems.

Consult the Town's website www.mymontverde.com to review the new Prohibited and Preferred Plant and Tree species list prior to starting a new project. Town staff would be happy to assist with questions regarding the new ordinance to help you plan a "Florida Friendly" landscape at your home.
