

# **NEWS FROM MAYOR JOE**

Hello, I hope you and your families are doing well! I thought I would bring you up to date on a few items. First, on the widening of the Turnpike from SR 50 (Clermont / Montverde Exit 272) going North there will be a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Meeting on Thursday, May 17, 2018 at the Minneola City Hall Gymnasium located at 800 North U.S. 27 Minneola, Florida. The meeting will be held as an Open House from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at which time the Public will review maps, drawings, and other pertinent information developed by FDOT. The big issues for the Montverde residents will be the three (3) bridges that will be affected. The bridge that we use on Old Hwy 50 that goes under the Turnpike next to Goreneck Springs Development is planned to remain open and the Turnpike bridge construction will take two (2) years to complete on that bridge because FDOT needs to leave that bridge open for Old Hwy 50 to be used. The next bridge that goes over the Turnpike on the way to Publix, using CR 455 will be completely closed for one (1) year. This will allow FDOT to complete this bridge quicker if it is closed completely for one (1) year. When finished It will be constructed with a roundabout on each side so to keep traffic moving and slow down traffic on the Old Hwy 50 side. The third bridge is the one we use to go under the Turnpike on Blackstill Road going to Clermont. This bridge will also stay open and take two (2) years to complete. We are still a year or so away from all this construction starting up and I will keep you updated on things as it moves along.

The next item is Ridgewood Avenue and CR 455. The repaving of Ridgewood Avenue and the new Roundabout on the corner of CR 455 and Ridgewood Avenue will happen at the same time which will be completed by the County. Doing these two (2) road projects at the same time will help make the time of repair shorter. The County has been working with the Town and I expect to see this project started soon. I will keep you informed going forward.

If possible, please come to our Council meetings that are on the second Tuesday of every month. We have a great dinner for everyone starting at 5:30 p.m. and then if you can stay the meeting starts at 7 p.m. (May 8<sup>th</sup> this month) Please feel free to call me with any questions at 407-496-1673 cell.

# YARD DEBRIS PROCEDURES

Place all garden and yard trash - including tree and shrub trimmings, grass clippings, palm fronds, and small tree branches - either in a 32 gallon trash can or commingled with garbage in a 96 gallon container, or in a suitable plastic bag. Shrubs, branches, limbs and palm fronds should not exceed four feet in length, and must be bundled and tied. No single item, can, bag or tied bundle should exceed 50 pounds in weight, other than the 96 gallon container. No more than four cans, bags or bundles may be set out for collection at one time. **Excessive amounts or bulk yard trash items:** If more than four cans, bags or tied bundles of yard trash need to be set out, or piles of heavy logs and/or stacks of wood fencing, please contact Waste Pro at **352-366-0352** to schedule a quote. Once payment is received, Waste Pro will schedule a rear loader collection vehicle or claw truck to collect excessive/bulk yard trash material.

## HYDRANT FLUSHING WILL BE CONTINUED

Hydrants in Town will continue to be flushed for annual maintenance. Should you have questions, please contact Town Hall.

# **10 Tips to Save Water for Water Conservation Month**

While the Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) encourages water conservation year-round, there is extra emphasis each April for Water Conservation Month. April is historically one of the driest months of the year and typically marks the peak demand season for public water suppliers.

With these 10 simple tips, you can lower your monthly water bill and do your part to save hundreds of gallons of water:

## INDOOR

Only run your washing machine and dishwasher when they are full.

• Use the shortest clothes washing cycle for lightly soiled loads; normal and permanent-press wash cycles use more water.

• Thaw frozen food in the refrigerator or microwave, not under running water.

- Scrape, don't rinse, your dishes before loading in the dishwasher.
- Install high-efficiency showerheads, faucets and toilets.

# OUTDOOR

- Check your home's irrigation system for leaks.
- Turn off your irrigation system and only water as needed.

• Don't leave sprinklers unattended. Use a kitchen timer to remind yourself to turn sprinklers off.

• Use a hose with a shutoff nozzle when washing the car.

• Consider installing a rain barrel with a drip irrigation system for watering your landscaping. Rainwater is free and better for your plants because it doesn't contain hard minerals.

Leaks are the biggest water waster, both inside and outside of your home. You can use your water meter to check for leaks. Turn off all faucets and water-using appliances and make sure no one uses water during the testing period. Wait for the hot water heater and ice cube makers to refill and for regeneration of water softeners. Go to your water meter and record the current reading. Wait 30 minutes. (Remember, no water should be used during this period.) Read the meter again. If the reading has changed, you have a leak.
