Mayor Joe's Message

Hello, hope you and your family are well and staying safe. I would like to keep you updated on a few topics. I had a drive around town meeting with Fred Schneider the Assistant County Manager. Our main purpose was to lay out a plan we could implement soon to slow down speeding traffic. The county has had the repaying of the north side of CR 455 from our downtown to the town limits on the Ferndale side in this year's budget and believe it will happen soon. They will then restripe the road to be more narrow and at the top of the hill by our town sign, they are changing the speed limit from 45 mph to 35 mph about a quarter mile before the sign coming from Ferndale. These two steps are called "Traffic Calming " and the county claims they have done this in different locations and have had much success. We have again increased our FHP officers patrolling time which we know slows down traffic at least while they are on duty. Ridgewood is also in this year's County budget to be repaved and will also have "Traffic Calming" steps in place to help with the speeding problem there. We will be watching this topic closely going forward and give you more updates.

Our Town Hall Team along with our Town Planner, and Attorney are all working on our JPA (Joint Planning Agreement) Update to present to the Town Council soon. This is the agreement we have with Lake County on very important topic dealing mostly with growth.
