Hello, hope you and your family are doing well and staying safe. The Town Council voted to keep the millage rate at 2.83 which is the same tax rate the Town of Montverde has had for many years for properties in town limits. The Council and the town hall team all do a very good job with managing the Town's finances.

The Council also put in place a new ordinance for buildings in Town that are deemed unfit and need to be torn down or brought up to good condition. I need to mention that if you are doing any kind of construction, demolishing, building etc. you should go on mymontverde.com and look at the ordinance page. Use the search bar to look for anything that might apply to your project to make sure it is done correctly and meets town code requirements. You can also call town hall and discuss your project with a team member.

Our Community Building in Kirk Park was scheduled to have a new floor installed and other items. After the vendor tore up the old wood floor there was major work that needed to be done to move forward with this project. The building is now getting leveled and structural beams are being installed before the new floor can be completed. This has put this project way behind on its completion date.

Town Manager's Message

Greetings,

I hope everyone is having a great summer. I was in a meeting a couple of weeks ago, and our town got brought up in the conversation. They commented on how beautiful our town is with all of the green grass, large trees, and that small-town charm we have been able to maintain. We often don't think how blessed we are to be in such a magnificent town. As you look at the surrounding communities, many of the green areas and trees are transitioning to concrete. Yet, in the middle of all that, here lies Montverde with its distinctive character and allure. As you know, the town has a new development being built on Blackstill Lake Road called Willow Ridge. The town council made a sagacious decision to annex this property into the town limits a few years ago. By doing so, they held the zoning to two homes per acre and a maximum of 234 homes. If it stayed in the county, it likely would have received a zoning designation of 4 homes per acre, allowing 468 homes to be built. Not only did the town keep the density down, but the town was able to guide some of the development features. As a result, when Willow Ridge Development is completed, there will be nearly 2,000 trees planted in and around the development. This rigorous landscaping requirement is an extraordinary enhancement that would not have occurred without it being within the town limits.

I am pleased to announce that the town has received a new grant of \$375,000 from the DEP. This grant money will be used for stormwater improvements to help keep our lakes clean. The \$375,000 is in addition to the \$2,000,000 stormwater grants we received earlier in the year. The town has secured nearly 14 million dollars in grant money over the past two years.

Finally, I want to thank all citizens that volunteer on committees, boards, and participate in council meetings—your work for the town is invaluable and much appreciated.
