Mayor's Message

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family well and in good health. I also hope everyone had a wonderful time at our Easter Egg Hunt this year! A big thank you goes out to our Townhall Team and Montverde Academy for their help in stuffing 10,000 eggs for the event. Here are a few updates:

Bella Collina Development Update

As previously mentioned, Bella Collina is moving forward with plans to develop the 58 acres they own off Ridgewood in Montverde. In addition, they've started the process of annexing 10 acres off Rt 455, bringing the total project to 68 acres. This development is expected to include around 115 homes, which still falls under our two-homes-per-acre density requirement. I'll continue to keep you updated as this progresses.

Water Rates

After reducing the water usage rate by 10% last year, and thanks to the excellent work of our Management and Public Works teams. The Council has determined that the usual 5% annual increase to the base water rate is not necessary this year. Our water system remains well-funded and well-maintained.

Town Budget Fiscal Year 2025–2026

Water Conservation In the kitchen or laundry

Town Manager's Message

Greetings,

At our last meeting, the town council approved a draft water facility plan for our drinking water. This plan will now be sent to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for review. When it is approved, it will unlock 12.9 million in grant funds to be used for capital improvements for our drinking water system. The proposed improvements include a new water tower, a redundant well, looping and increasing the size of several water mains, and replacing some older fire hydrants.

Over the past month, the town has made several improvements around the town hall area. A new roof was put on the town hall, replacing many rotted underlayment boards. Landscaping, walkways, and benches were added around the park area at the new library. Pavers and new trees donated by the Keys family were installed in the dog park.

Thank you to our volunteers, staff, and all those who helped make this year's Easter egg scramble a wonderful event for our community. Special thanks to the Montverde Academy kids who volunteered and stuffed 10,000 eggs, which were picked up in less than 90 seconds.

Finally, I want to invite you to celebrate the opening of the Butterfly Garden located by the sports court. Before the council meeting, we will hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony on May 13th at 6:00 pm in the butterfly garden.
