First and foremost, don't forget to vote on Tuesday, November 4th, 2025. This election includes two open Council positions, with four candidates running. We also have a proposed Charter Amendment on the ballot. If passed, this change will require a supermajority vote which is 4 out of 5 Council Members to approve any changes related to housing density, specifically the current limit of two homes per acre gross. This is a significant decision that affects how our town grows, and your voice matters. Local elections have a major impact on our daily lives, so please come out and make your vote count.

We're also thrilled to be celebrating the grand opening of our new town Library. After much planning and hard work, the big day is finally here! The grand opening will be on October 14th at 5pm. We will be serving dinner to everyone, and our monthly Town Council meeting will start at 7pm, please join if possible. We hope everyone will come out and be part of this monumental event for our community.

In other great news, construction has officially started on our new Regional Fire Station. This long-awaited project is becoming a reality, and once completed, it will bring state-of-the-art fire equipment and ambulances right inside our town limits. Having faster response times will make a real difference in saving lives and protecting property. We're proud to be bringing this level of service to our community.

I would like to recognize two outstanding community members: Dan Davis and Terry Inklebarger. Both have volunteered for years on the Town's Safety Committee, driving around in the Public Safety SUV and calling the police if they see anything concerning. These volunteers are an extra set of eyes and ears for our community, and their work is greatly appreciated. Please note, their role is strictly focused on public safety and has nothing to do with code enforcement.
