With the start of the new fiscal year, I would like to present my annual "State of the Town" report:

Budget

Residents:

For 2016, staff and I created and presented a **balanced budget** to Council, while keeping your property tax rate the same that it has been for the last seven years. I have pursued and obtained two grants that will provide recreational improvements: one will allow for a trailway extension along CR 455, and the other will pay for a new boat ramp on Lake Apopka. I hope to begin construction on these projects in 2016.

Another initiative I brought about is two water and sewer agreements with Oakland and Clermont. To recap, a new subdivision outside of Oakland was in need of water and sewer services. With the Town's attorney and consultant, I negotiated an agreement whereby the developer will install the infrastructure, while the Town will take possession, monitor and provide services. This initiative will result in net revenue of \$50,000 to the Town each year, while adding \$1 million of infrastructure assets on the Town's books. This new revenue stream will reduce the financial burden on the Montverde taxpayer.

Public Safety

From your phone calls, I know that many of you were concerned that the contract with the Sheriff's Office to have a deputy in Montverde would be terminated. I am proud to say that your Council voted 3-2 to approve the contract to keep providing this protection to residents (see November 2014 Council meeting minutes on our website). I have a great working relationship with Sheriff Gary Borders, and I am happy to say that his office has been very responsive to Montverde's needs. We have also augmented the Sheriff's coverage with FHP officers that help with traffic enforcement.

Additionally, I have worked with our Fire Chief to bring 24/7 coverage to Montverde. Our department is a volunteer force, but we need firefighters at the station at all times for fire and medical emergencies. In the past year, we have created scheduling for our volunteers to occupy the station around the clock, and because of this, we have seen our response times decrease greatly. All of this has been done with no increased cost to the Town. I greatly appreciate our Fire department, and believe that this is one of the best departments the Town has had.

Staff

At the end of last year, we hired a new Town Clerk, Billing Clerk, and Librarian. As you know, Mary Gillis and Chris Zuccaro left full-time employment to take better job opportunities. Unfortunately, with Montverde being such a small town, opportunity for advancement is limited, so we sometimes lose employees when better opportunities come along. But our new staff has done well this year, and special recognition should be given to Librarian Kathleen Gifford: I agree with residents' sentiments that she has been a phenomenal addition and has greatly improved the Library.

And as always, our faithful Public Works department deserves recognition for all that they do. Terry Burden is my right-hand man and I'm proud of the many construction projects, renovations, water system upgrades, and grants that we have accomplished together.

Finally, I would like to thank the Town Council. They are a diverse group of individuals with differing passions, but each of them has a true desire to protect and enhance our Town. I am tremendously proud of the relationship I have with each of them, and am grateful that I can help bring about compromise and consensus to keep Montverde moving in a positive direction.
