Simple steps can save water indoors and outdoors

Finding and fixing leaks is a good place to start. A leaky toilet or faucet can waste thousands of gallons of water each month, putting a hefty dent in your wallet. Your water fixtures may use more water than you think. Installing low-flow toilets and showerheads can dramatically reduce your indoor water consumption without reduced performance. Outdoors, lawn and landscape irrigation accounts for about half of all residential water use. Watering wisely outside the home saves water and promotes healthier lawns and landscapes.

Overwatering a lawn can promote weeds and insect pests, as well as weakened grass roots. Broken or misdirected sprinkler heads spray water onto sidewalks and pavement where it evaporates or trickles into storm drains. You can save water by irrigating lawns and landscapes only when they need it, by properly maintaining your irrigation system and by landscaping with plants and grass that require minimal water. A well-designed and properly maintained Florida landscape will stay beautiful with minimal care.

Montverde Day planning is in full gear! I am excited to announce that we are adding another full day to this great annual event. Montverde Day will now be held on Friday, November 5th, Saturday, November 6th, and Sunday, November 7th. The event will showcase over 7 different bands and acts, plus will feature a new carnival company with expanded rides. There will be additional information and programming material in future newsletters—so stay tuned.

I am pleased to announce we have replaced the spider crawler at Kirk Park. The old one was removed after staff inspected the crawler and determined it was at the end of it's useful life. We now have a fantastic new crawler that will provide many years of fun for our children. Staff has installed new lighting at Lake Florence and Truskett Park. It looks beautiful and will increase safety at both parks. The town has ordered some small playground equipment for Truskett Park, which should be installed in early October.

I want to thank all of the residents who attended the meeting to discuss the water quality of our local lakes. Please remember to use non-phosphorus fertilizer and blow grass clippings away from the streets, so they do not end up in the storm drains. It is also recommended that you have your septic tank pumped or at least inspected every three years. This will prevent costly repairs for you down the road and will help maintain the town's water quality.

Finally, I want to remind everyone that children are back in school. Please be mindful and alert while driving, especially in school zones.
